



Integrated Accelerator Program (IAP)

The Integrated Accelerator Program is a two-semester program designed specifically for international students who demonstrate an advanced level of English-language proficiency and who also want academic, cultural, professional and linguistic support. The program features a robust advising and mentorship component, as well as priority access to the most exclusive, in-demand courses. Students may enter the program in the spring, summer or fall. Upon completion of the program, students progress into year two of their undergraduate education with a full year's worth of academic credits.

- > For the high-achieving international student, the Integrated Accelerator Program provides an exclusive and academically rigorous freshman year experience.
- ➤ Have priority access to a selection of courses that fits your interests and career goals.

Academic Accelerator Program (AAP)

The Academic Accelerator Program is a two-semester program designed specifically for students who are ready to succeed in immersive English-speaking classrooms, but who also want to benefit from English-language and student support. The program curriculum offers a balance of University-wide and AAP-exclusive courses, with English-language course supplements that equip students with the practical, subject-specific vocabulary and skills they need to excel in all classes. Students may enter the program in the spring, summer or fall. Upon completion of the program, students progress into year two of their undergraduate education with a full year's worth of academic credits.

BENEFITS OF THE AAP

- > With just the right amount of support when you need it, the Advanced Accelerator Program features a curriculum designed to accommodate your academic and English-language needs.
- ➤ Credit-bearing, so you can earn a full freshman year's worth of credits while taking courses tailored to your needs as an international student, helping you achieve your academic and career goals.



Upon successful completion of the Career Accelerator, you will have the opportunity to receive internship placement assistance. Based on your track and professional goals, you will gain access to exclusive internships at leading global corporations, working closely with your Career Accelerator advisor to get placed in the internship that's best for you. For example, if you are an Entrepreneurship Track student, you might intern for a tech startup in Silicon Valley, while a Sponsored Business Development Track student might intern for a multi-national corporation such as Google, Deloitte, ExxonMobile or Microsoft.



José Hernandez, '85

ASTRONAUT

The son of migrant farm workers, José Hernandez went from dreaming under the stars to actually reaching them. The 1985 Pacific graduate and former NASA astronaut was one of seven crewmembers aboard the Discovery space shuttle when it was launched into space on August 28, 2009. Hernandez served as a flight engineer and operated the shuttle's robotic arm. Born in French Camp and raised in Stockton, José attended Pacific through the Community Involvement Program (CIP), a scholarship program for underrepresented students. Here, he earned a bachelor's degree in electrical engineering. He later received a master's degree in the same field from the University of California, Santa Barbara.

Dave Brubeck, '42

PIANIST AND COMPOSER

Jazz icon Dave Brubeck was a world-renowned pianist and composer of jazz and classical music. His experimentation with unexplored time signatures introduced millions of listeners to jazz. A 1942 graduate of Pacific, Brubeck achieved extraordinary success throughout his music career, including the Dave Brubeck Quartet's highly acclaimed album Time Out (1959), which sold more than 1 million copies. While attending Pacific, he met his wife, lola Whitlock, who would later become his business manager and lyricist. A plaque marking the spot where Dave first met lola can be found inside the Faye Spanos Concert Hall.

Khushwinder Gill, '06 PRINCIPAL

To combat the low test scores and lack of physical activity that affect schoolchildren across the country, 2006 Pacific graduate Khushwinder Gill has implemented successful after-school programs. He was named "Principal of the Year" by California Governor Jerry Brown in 2011.

Mark Amodei, '83 CONGRESSMAN

Mark Amodei became a U.S. congressman after winning a seat in the U.S. House of Representatives on September 13, 2011. After handedly winning a special election to fill a vacant House seat, the 1983 Pacific graduate now represents Nevada's Congressional District 2.


Scott Boras, '77 & '82 SPORTS AGENT

Scott Boras is one of the most powerful people in Major League Baseball. The former minor-league outfielder has negotiated some of the game's biggest contracts, including a 10-year, \$252 million contract for Yankees infielder Alex Rodriguez. At Pacific, Boras was an outfielder and captain of the baseball team.









National studies have shown that students who live on campus earn higher grades, are more likely to graduate and report higher levels of satisfaction with their collegiate experience.

HOUSING

University of the Pacific is a residential university. Most of its students live on campus in residence halls operated by the University's Housing Office. Although most residence halls are coeducational (for both men and women), students live in dorm rooms with roommates of the same gender. The university also has facilities exclusively for women. The university requires all first and second-year students to live in university housing. Exceptions may be made for those living with their parent(s) or for those who request to live off campus for medical or religious reasons. The university has limited facilities for married students.

DINING

Pacific offers a variety of dining options through different plans and facilities, including the Marketplace (the main dining hall), The Lair, Calaveras Coffee House, Davey Café, Health Sciences Café, the Grove and the E.A.T. gourmet food truck. Each facility features a variety of menus, which include options such as salads, homestyle soups, a wide selection of entrées and vegetables, freshly baked desserts and beverages. At least one vegetarian entrée is featured at each meal.

All students living on campus are required to participate in a meal plan. Instead of having a limited number of meals per day or year, you have the ability to use Dining Points to buy food that you want to eat, whenever and wherever you are hungry. The Resident Dining Account works like a debit card, which you load with prepaid funds at the beginning of each semester.

Ways to Enter

 submitting an application. If you are admitted to the UAP you will be
 bound by these terms for the duration of your Program. In addition to
 these terms and conditions, as a student at University of the Pacific
 (UOP) you will be bound by the rules and regulations governing
 UOP, as those may be amended from time to time. These rules and

- UOP and UOP International reserve the right to amend these terms and conditions from time to time. By accepting these terms and conditions you acknowledge and agree to comply at all times with the then-current terms and conditions, found at: [uopinternational.org/ terms-and-conditions].
- 3. Application: Students may apply to the UAP (Extended, Academic, or Integrated), or to Pre-Sessional English (collectively the "Programs"). If you apply to any of these Programs, be sure to use the application that is specific to the Program you select. Each application contains terms & conditions governing the specific Program and you acknowledge that by submitting an application you agree to the terms and conditions of your respective Program. Links to applications can be found here: [uopinternational.org].
- 4. Transfer Credits: Students applying to the UAP with post-secondary college credits are subject to additional requirements. You must disclose any post-secondary college credits at the time of application. If you have taken credit-bearing university-level courses after the completion of high school you must meet the current secondary school required GPA requirements (U.S. equivalent of a 2.5 GPA) as well as an 2.8 average GPA for all post-secondary college credits, regardless of whether or not you wish to transfer that credit to UOP. There is no limit on the number or type of post-secondary credits a student may have taken when determining their admissibility to the UAP. Vocational and ESL studies are not considered during the admissions review process. Transfer credits must be submitted to an accredited evaluation service (WES, SILNY) as soon as possible after acceptance into the UAP. Transfer credits are articulated after the completion of the UAP and will apply toward academic years 2, 3, and 4; under no circumstances will transfer credits apply to the UAP. You acknowledge that UOP and UOP International make no representations and cannot guarantee that post-secondary college credits will be accepted.
- Admission: If you are admitted to the UOP International UAP at UOP you will receive a written offer letter with details and instructions on accepting the offer, paying the Program deposit and arriving on campus.
- Tuition and fees payment: Following payment of the deposit, you
 must pay the remaining outstanding balance shown on the UAP
 invoice by the following posted payment deadline of the Program and
 semester in which you will enroll:

You are responsible for paying the full invoice amount, including any banking or processing fees. UOP International has the right to amend prices due to University actions, governmental actions, or other events beyond its control.

- 7. Failure to Pay: Failure to pay by your applicable posted payment deadline may lead to penalties, including late fees, inability to gain access to campus housing and use of a meal plan, and a hold on your account that will prevent you from enrolling in classes. Pursuant to section 20 of these terms and conditions, we will be required to report you to the U.S. Department of Homeland Security ("DHS") if you are unable to enroll due to nonpayment of tuition and fees and you may lose immigration status.
- 8. Cancellation, Change, Curtailment or Withdrawal: You will only be eligible for a deposit refund if you submit documentation of visa denial with written notification to the UOP International prior to the move-in date. If you cancel your enrollment prior to your Program move-in date (see table below for the move-in date applicable to you) you may request a full refund of your deposit, tuition and fees, less any non-refundable fees. After the start of the Program you may be eligible for the following partial Program refunds:

Cancellations made prior to your Program start date but after your arrival to the U.S. on a UOP-issued Form I-20 will be governed under the standard UOP student immigration policies. Please refer to the table below for the Program start date applicable to you.

- 9. Refunds: UOP International will only make refunds in U.S. Dollars, minus bank transfer and processing fees, and will make such refunds in the manner in which UOP International was originally paid and to the account of the party or parties who made such payment(s). All refunds will be made to eligible parties within 45 days of a written request.
- 10. Airport Transfers: Requests for airport transfer service should be made at least 2 weeks in advance of arrival by visiting [uopinternational.org/welcome]. Airport transfers are available for your initial arrival on campus for flights arriving at San Francisco International Airport (SFO) and Sacramento International Airport (SMF). UOP International cannot guarantee a reservation for a request made less than 2 weeks in advance. If your flight is cancelled or delayed, you must call the emergency telephone number published in the Next Steps Brochure to inform UOP International staff of the new arrival date or time. Airport transfer fees are nonrefundable.
- 11. Housing Accommodation and Meal Plan: You are required to commit to a reservation in approved UOP International housing for the full duration of your program. Payment for housing is due in full two weeks prior to the move-in date (see the table below for your applicable move-in date). Later notification or failure to notify UOP International may result in additional costs. If you are unable to live on campus you must submit a Housing Waiver Form to UOP International when you send your official acceptance to the UAP offer letter. The requirement to live in UOP International housing will be waived only in extenuating circumstances. Refunds may be pro-rated for cancellations made after the move-in date of your Program. You must also purchase and enroll in a meal plan for the duration of your Program. The cost of a meal plan is nonrefundable.

- 12. Health Insurance: All international students studying at UOP are required to be covered by health insurance that meets the U.S. Government, California, and UOP requirements. Not all services are covered, and the student is responsible for any outstanding balances for non-covered services.
 - At the time of application, you are required to purchase coverage from a UOP International-designated health plan as a condition of enrollment.
 - b. You must have a completed Health Services immunization compliance requirements documenting proof of immunity to Measles (Rubeola), Mumps and German Measles (Rubella) [MMR]; one Diphtheria/Tetanus booster within the past ten years; Tubercolosis screening; two doses of Varicella (chicken pox) vaccine; series of Hepatitis B vaccine; and the Meningoccocal vaccine. Students must also submit a Health History. Mandatory Immunization Forms may be obtained here: [http://www.pacific.edu/immunizationcompliance]. You must have completed immunization documentation prior to class registration in order to enroll in any courses.
 - c. The cost of health insurance is non-refundable.
- Academic Resources: All books and learning materials must be purchased upon arrival at UOP through the UOP bookstore or other recommended sources.
- 14. Vacation, Holidays, and School Closures: UAP students must adhere to the UOP Academic Calendar for holidays and vacations. Classes will not be held on designated school vacations and may be cancelled on public holidays. UOP International will not make reimbursements for classes not offered due to holidays, vacations, or school closures due to emergencies.
- 15. Absences: Failure to meet attendance requirements may lead to penalties, including loss of immigration status and deportation. You will not receive a refund if you lose immigration status due to class absences.
- 16. Academic Performance: Students are accepted to the UAP with the strict understanding that progression through the UAP and successful completion of any Program will require satisfactory attendance. successful attainment of specified progression criteria, and adherence to the UOP Honor Code, which can be found at [http://www.pacific. edu/Campus-Life/Safety-and-Conduct/Student-Conduct/Tiger-Lore-Student-Handbook-/Honor-Code.html]. To continue in the UAP, you must also be in compliance with the UOP International UAP academic standards and progression requirements, which can be found at: [uopinternational.org/uap-progression-requirements]. You will not be allowed to proceed if you do not meet the criteria for successful completion of your Program. If you are unable to proceed, you may be offered advice on suitable alternatives, including repeating courses or dismissal from UOP. - 20. F-1 Status: In order to maintain proper F-1 status, you must comply with all applicable Federal regulations related to study in the U.S., including pursuit of a full course of study. You will be in jeopardy of losing your immigration status if you fail to maintain the necessary academic standing. We will be required to report you to the SEVIS database of the DHS for any violation of your F-1 status. Your personally identifiable information, including course enrollment details and changes, and circumstances of any suspected breach by you of UOP's or UOP International's policies may be shared with the DHS, UOP, and accrediting agencies, designated authorities, your parents, and UOP International staff and agents. If you intend to seek non-F-1 or L-2 visa status at any point during your anticipated tenure at UOP, you must disclose such intent at the time of application. You will be dismissed from the Program if it is revealed that you intend to change your immigration status or if your status actually changes. No refunds will be given if you must leave the Program due to change or loss of F-1 or L-2 status.
- 21. Photography, Filming and Sound Recording: The UOP International UAP at University of the Pacific or its representatives, affiliates, successors and related companies may arrange to photograph or shoot video footage of students for purposes of advertising, public relations, and/or promotion in any medium throughout the world, including on social media sites and on the internet. If you do not wish to participate you must advise us in writing and state at the time of the photography or video shooting the wish not to participate. By accepting these terms and conditions you are indicating your consent to use these photographs or video footage without further consent or notifications unless you follow the above opt-out requirements.
- 22. FERPA: In accordance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA), the undersigned student hereby permits UOP and UOP International to disclose personally identifiable information, including educational records, financial information and, attendance records to student's parent(s), guardian(s), sponsor(s), sponsorship bodies, and recruiter(s) with information pertaining to their application, academic progress, results and attendance. These permissions will remain in effect during the undersigned student's tenure in the UAP and at UOP unless the student submits a written revocation of this permission to UOP's Office of the Registrar.
- 23. Force majeure: UOP and UOP International will not be liable in cases where UOP and/or UOP International is unable to fulfill any services because of fire, natural disaster, national emergency, act of government, acts of war or terrorism, failure of suppliers or subcontractors, labor disputes or any other reasons which are beyond UOP's or UOP International's control.
- 24. Liability: The liability of the UOP International UAP at University of the Pacific, its operator, Shorelight-Tigercat, LLC, its parent Shorelight Education, LLC, and their group companies (the "Operator"), their directors, officers, employees, affiliates, agents and partners with respect to losses arising from negligence (except where such liability cannot be excluded as a matter of law), breach of contract or otherwise will be limited in all circumstances to the full amount paid to UOP. UOP International or the relevant group company by the relevant student for the particular Program. Such companies and persons will in no circumstances have any liability for indirect or consequential losses or damages. Any dispute, claim or other matter arising will be subject to the jurisdiction and laws of California without regard to the choice of law rules. Any legal suit, action or proceeding seeking to enforce any provision of, or based on any right or issues arising out of or related to these terms and conditions, shall be brought exclusively in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of California.
