## Master of Science in Biomechanics

The Master of Science in Biomechanics program has a mission to prepare students for both advanced studies in human movement science and career paths such as physical therapy, medicine exercise science. With a diverse field, Biomechanics offers a wide variety of career possibilities and specializations. The varied curriculum of Marshall's MS in Biomechanics program prepares students for this varied career field.

## Master of Arts in Geography

Marshall University's Master of Arts in Geography program will provide you with an interdisciplinary approach to the field. As a graduate of this program, you will be able to understand and address many modern-day challenges including climate change, natural resource management, economic development, urban planning, and ethnic conflict resolution.

## Master of Arts in Journalism

The MAJ program gives students many opportunities for hands-on learning with a modern television studio and equipment and a focus on digital media production and design. This degree program prepares graduates for a variety of professions related to Journalism and Mass Communications, as well as provides marketable skills for many other career fields.

## Master of Public Health
